

## **CHAPTER 11**

### **HEALTH AND WELFARE**

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**11.01 BOARD OF HEALTH AND HEALTH OFFICER.** The Village hereby elects to come under the jurisdiction of the Door County Health Commission.

**11.02 COMPULSORY CONNECTION TO SEWER AND WATER.**

**(1) WHEN REQUIRED.** Whenever a public sewer or water main becomes available to any building used for human habitation, the Village Board shall notify the owner or his agent in writing in the manner prescribed by **262.08, Wis. Stats.**, or by registered mail addressed to the last known address of the owner or his agent. The notice required by this section shall direct the owner or his agent to connect to such mains within 6 months.

**(2) PRIVIES PROHIBITED.** The erection or use of privies anywhere in the Village is hereby prohibited, except for temporary use during a construction period as provided in **146.20 (2) (c) , Wis. Stats.**

**(3) INDIVIDUAL DISPOSAL SYSTEMS.** Until a municipal sewage system is constructed in the Village, an individual water carried septic system adequate to dispose of all waste in a method which will not create a nuisance and endanger the public health is acceptable. Individual water and sewerage disposal systems must be installed in accordance with the requirements of **ILHR 82.20, Wis. Adm. Code**, and must be approved by the County Sanitary Engineer.

**11.03 KEEPING OF ANIMALS AND FOWL. (1) SANITARY**

**REQUIREMENTS.** All structures, pens, buildings, stables, coops or yards wherein animals or fowl are kept shall be maintained in a clean and sanitary condition, free of rodents, vermin and objectionable odors.

**(2) ANIMALS EXCLUDED FROM FOOD HANDLING ESTABLISHMENTS.** No person shall take or permit to remain any dog, cat or other live animal within any premises where food is sold, offered for sale or processed for consumption by the general public.

**11.04 FOOD HANDLING. (1) PLACES OF BUSINESS.** The following regulations shall apply to any person operating any hotel, café, restaurant or other public eating place or operating any bakery, meat market, grocery store,

dairy or other establishment where food products to be consumed by others are handled, offered for sale, prepared or served.

- (2) **SANITATION.** (a) The provisions of **97.46, Wis. Stats.**, relating to covering and display of any food and dairy products are hereby adopted by reference and incorporated in this chapter as if fully set forth herein.
- (b) All premises shall be kept clean and free of litter or rubbish. All garbage and rubbish shall be kept in suitable, airtight containers so as not to become a nuisance and shall be disposed of daily in a sanitary manner. No sleeping room, urinal, water closet, ash pit or coal bin shall connect directly with any room used for preparation, storing or serving of food. Between May 1 and October 1, all doors, windows and apertures shall be effectively screened and doors shall be self-closing to prevent the entrance of flies. All equipment shall be kept clean and free from dust, dirt, insects and other contaminating material.
- (3) **EQUIPMENT AND UTENSILS.** In order to ensure proper cleansing and disinfection of glasses, cups, dishes and other eating utensils in restaurants, they shall be thoroughly washed and sanitized after each use by one of the methods described in **HSS 196.13, Wis. Adm. Code**, which is incorporated in this section by reference as if fully set forth herein. Glasses or utensils may be chilled in cold running water or dry cold chests, but shall not be chilled in a stationary container of cold or ice water.

**11.05 GRADE "A" MILK REQUIRED.** No person shall sell, offer or expose for sale any milk or milk product other than grade "A" milk as those terms are defined in **Ch. AG 80, Wis. Adm. Code**, issued by the State Department of Agriculture and State Department of Health and Social Services, which is hereby incorporated in this section by reference as if fully set forth herein. The Clerk is directed to file a certified copy of such regulations in his office for public inspection.

**11.06 MEAT INSPECTION.** No person shall sell, have, keep or expose for sale for human consumption the flesh or meat food products of any cow, calf, sheep, swine, horse, goat or fowl in the Village, unless the same shall have been slaughtered, inspected or prepared under the supervision of a United States government inspector or in accordance with the regulations governing the inspection of meat as prescribed by the United States Department of Agriculture, Bureau of Animal Industry, **Title 9, Ch. 1 (a), C.F.R.**

**11.07 ABATEMENT OF HEALTH NUISANCES.** The Village Board, together with the County Health Commission and Village appointed officers, shall have the power to abate health nuisances in accordance with **146.14, Wis. Stats.**, which is hereby adopted by reference and made part of this section as if fully set forth herein.

**11.10 PENALTY.**

1. Except as otherwise provided, any person who shall violate any provision of this chapter or any order, rule or regulation promulgated hereunder, shall be subject to a penalty as provided in **25.04 of this code of Ordinances.**
2. A separate offense shall be deemed committed on each day on which such violation occurs or continues after the date set by the Village Board or a court of record for the completion of the correction of the violation.
